## **Big Bin Events are Back!**



Residents can drop off their large household waste at any Big Bin Event for free. These can be items like mattresses, furniture and large appliances that are too large for curbside pickup. Household hazardous waste is not being accepted and should be taken to an Eco Station at no cost instead.

Please note: All residents must unload their own vehicles. They must also maintain physical distancing and are encouraged to wear a mask. Residents can expect wait times to be longer than usual this year due to these changes.

## **Belmont Sobeys Heroes for Hunger Initiative**

As we welcome our students back to school in September, we want to remind the community about the ways in which our community partners stepped up to serve families who struggled during the shutdown in spring.


Belmont Sobeys launched an initiative to raise funds to battle food insecurity, and received overwhelming support from the community. Bannerman Community League's contribution to the initiative was added to a final pot of \$15,000 raised by Belmont Sobeys manager, Jerry MacLachlan. Funds were distributed to families of children attending the selected schools, who were identified as facing food insecurity during the pandemic.

\$10,000 of the money raised went to EPSB to be distributed to the following Schools:



## Who is the Graffiti Granny?

In 2014, the neighbourhood of Callingwood North struggled with excessive, vulgar and extremely damaging graffiti throughout the community and along the Whitemud Drive sound barrier walls and walkover bridge. By working in partnership with Capital City Clean Up and Edmonton Police Service, two community members (Cathy Backewich and Mike Arychuk) took daily ownership of the walls and bridge by painting over graffiti vandalism. Within 3 months the number of tags had dropped by 80%, proof that if graffiti is cleaned-up within hours of being displayed, the taggers will move on. Cathy was so diligent that one tagger covered 4 sections of the sound barrier wall with a direct message to the "Graffiti Granny."



Since that new call sign was given to Cathy, she has become well known as Graffiti Granny and in her words, "no better name could be bestowed on me as we all know you can mess with a lot of people but don't ever mess with a Granny!"


